OPINION

Lake Hayward residents need to be made aware of the shameful amount of fireworks debris that is being shot into the lake. In the early morning of July 4th, before the Independence Day celebrations should have even begun, I was rowing on the lake and discovered dozens of wood, paper, and plastic remains of fireworks. These were floating near the middle of the lake just south of Second Beach. In the past few years, I've picked up fireworks debris from the lake bottom at Second Beach throughout the season, so I can just imagine how much debris there is at the bottom in deeper water. Much fuss is made about litter on the beaches which is easy to pick up. Trash shot into the lake is a much more serious problem and we should strongly urge people not to shoot fireworks into the water.

BEACH RULES - (PLEASE INFORM GUESTS AND RENTERS OF THESE RULES)

1. Parents or chaperones are responsible for their child's safety and their child's actions at all times.
2. Children cannot be left at the beach unattended.
3. Infants must be in leak-proof ("swimmie") diapers at all times.
4. Fishing within 100 feet of the swimming area is strictly prohibited.
5. Use of boats and watercraft within the swimming area or within 100 feet of rafts is prohibited.
6. When passing a beach area, dogs must be on a leash. Dogs are never allowed on the beach.
7. There is no swimming after 11pm
8. All trash and cigarette butts must be removed from the beach and be properly disposed of.
9. Use of the beach area is limited to Association members and their guests.

SNAKE SAFETY

Although venomous snakes live in Connecticut, leaving them alone will stop any chance of danger to you or the animal. This applies to ALL wildlife.

Venomous snakes

- Copperhead
- Timber Rattle Snake

Non-Venomous snakes

- Black Rat Snake
- Common Garter Snake
- Dekey Brown Snake
- Eastern Ribbon Snake
- Eastern Worm Snake

Non-Venomous continued

- Northern Black Racer
- Northern Ring Snake
- Ring Neck Snake
- Smooth Green Snake
- Eastern Hognose Snake (often confused with Timber Rattlers)
- Northern Water Snakes: These are often killed by Lake Hayward beach-goers simply because they think they have found a venomous Copperhead. Northern Water Snakes are actually harmless and rid the area of many unwanted pests including mice.
- PLEASE leave ALL wildlife alone unless they are inside your home. Outdoors is their only habitat and we should help protect it.

Ways to identify a venomous snake vs. a non-venomous one:

Copperhead

- Lives in rocky dry terrain
- Fatter head than body

Timber Rattler

- Lives on mountains
- Fatter head than body
- Rattle on tail

If you have been bitten by a snake that you suspect is venomous, seek IMMEDIATE medical attention.
