For those of you who missed it, East Haddam's budget passed in the second referendum. The \$28,359,313 budget passed with 482 "yes" votes to 367 "no" votes. The



mil rate for the October 1, 2012 Grand List is 26.01 up from 21.52 from the previous year due to the revaluation and budget approved for 2013. You should be receiving your town tax bill sometime in August.

POALH tax bills have been sent and we have been busy answering your questions regarding revaluations, and the POALH mil rate needed to meet the budget passed last year. Read comments on the mil rate by Ed Bader (see page 2), our budget committee chair, as he addresses questions from the community and explains the calculation for the 2013 tax period.

Last weekend I had the pleasure of meeting with association members who live in the North End on Pilgrim Way. It was a casual conversation and cocktail hour centered around the needs and concerns of residents in that area. The first thing I learned was that Pilgrim Way is really Pilgrim Lane! There is a deep concern for our quality of life that is centered around the waters of

Lake Hayward; weed control, and the drainage issues that threaten property as well as lake quality. We discussed the maintenance and identification of association right-ofways and how to organize work parties and even some future thoughts regarding the management of Lake Hayward Association and its properties. Look for more information on this subject in future newsletters. The spirit of volunteerism and ways to engage our membership were also discussed and I walked away with the commitment to run more casual town hall venues in both the on and off season to allow people to offer ideas and comment on various topics before the Board. Thank you to Fred and Mary Odell for hosting the get together. If other neighborhoods are interested in engaging in some discussions. please let me know and I will be happy to make myself available.

We are looking for some help in our weekly water-testing program. We need someone to collect water samples from each beach and bring to them to the lab in Old Saybrook or Columbia for testing. If you can help, even for one or two weeks, please let me know.

I am looking forward to celebrating Independence Day with family and friends. See you tonight at 2nd Beach!

MIL RATE INCREASE

All Association property owners should have received their tax bills during the past 10 days. Questions have been raised regarding the increase in the mil rate from .0028 to .0040. The increase is due to several factors:

- The 2013-14 budget (\$166,000) was approved at the August 2012 Association meeting. This was an increase of \$14,000 from the prior year. Both the Budget Committee and the Board carefully reviewed the budget and determined it was appropriate to adequately serve all the members and maintain the level of services the Association has provided in the past.
- At the August 2012 meeting we explained to those members present that the Town of East Haddam was going through a revaluation of properties and we would not know what the revaluation would do to the total of the Grand List of property values in the Association. When the revaluation was completed and we compared the total Grand List value of properties of Association members, we determined that assessed values decreased from \$54.3 million to \$41.5 million in the aggregate (a 23.5% decline in value). Some properties increased in assessed value while the bulk of Association properties declined.

In summary, the increase is due to:

-Increase in the budget from \$152,000 to \$166,000 0003 mils
-Decrease in the Grand List from \$54.3 mm to \$41.5mm 0009 mils
-2012 mil rate 0028 mils
-2013 mil rate 0040 mils

The Board of Governors approved the mil rate of .0040 for 2013 based on the budget approved by the members at the August 2012 meeting and the significant reduction in the Grand List. The Budget Committee is working on the 2014-15 budget that will be presented to the members at the August meeting.

BEACH RULES - (PLEASE INFORM GUESTS AND RENTERS OF THESE RULES)

- 1. Parents or chaperones are responsible for their child's safety and their child's actions at all times.
- 2. Children cannot be left at the beach unattended.
- 3. Infants must be in leak-proof ("swimmie") diapers at all times.
- 4. Fishing within 100 feet of the swimming area is strictly prohibited.
- 5. Use of boats and watercraft within the swimming area or within 100 feet of rafts is prohibited.
- 6. When passing a beach area, dogs must be on a leash. Dogs are never allowed on the beach.
- 7. There is no swimming after 11pm.
- 8. All trash and cigarette butts must be removed from the beach and be properly disposed of. Glass containers are prohibited on Association property.
- 9. Use of the beach area is limited to Association members and their guests.
- 10. Cars parking in a beach parking area must display a POALH parking sticker or a guest pass.
