Raccoons, skunks, fisher cats, mice, stray dogs, cats – do you want these animals going through your trash, spreading it around, making an unsightly and unhealthy mess for you and your neighbors? Of course you don't. Please be respectful of your neighbors and make trash pickup easier for All-Waste by following a few simple guide-



- lines:
- Store garbage containers under your cottage, inside a shed, inside a specially made container or in your garage until the day of pickup
 - Choose a garbage container with a tight fitting lid
 - Do not put your garbage out until the morning of

pickup or, if you must put it out the night before, be sure that the cover is on securely

- Do not leave trash bags out overnight
- Do not mix garbage with recyclables

Monday garbage pickup continues until Sept. 8

All-Waste Control will collect trash and recyclables twice a week (Monday and Friday) through Sept. 8. The Town of East Haddam has implemented "single stream recycling" so it is no longer necessary to separate the various recyclables into separate containers and/or put them out on separate days. All recyclables can be combined and placed into a single container and put out with your regular trash. We must recycle:

1. Glass and metal food and beverage containers (rinsed); lids go in trash

(No broken glass, mugs, windowpanes, ceramics, light bulbs, mirrors, dishes or tempered glass)

2. Plastic containers Nos. 1 through 7 (rinsed); lids go in trash
3. Newspaper, magazines, cereal/pasta boxes, milk and juice cartons, junk mail (No phone books, wax- or plastic-coated cardboard, soiled newspaper or magazines, books, plastic (Tyvek) envelopes)

4. Cardboard (broken down) (No wax coated boxes, soiled boxes, pizza boxes)

Please place your trash in a covered container if it will be outside at night.

POALH LEGAL NOTICE PAYMENT OF PROPERTY TAXES

All persons liable to pay real estate taxes to the Property Owners' Association of Lake Hayward as levied on the October 1, 2014 Grand List are hereby notified that the taxes are due and payable on July 1, 2015 at the mill rate of 3.50. The taxes will become delinquent on August 3, 2015 if not paid by this date. Delinquent tax bills shall be subject to interest of 1.5 percent per month reverting to the due date, July 1, 2015. The minimum interest charge is \$2. All persons in the Tax District who do not receive a tax bill should call the Tax Collector at 860-295-8769 to obtain their bill before the end of the grace period, August 3, 2015. Failure to receive a property tax bill does not invalidate the payment of the tax or related delinquent interest charge if not paid by August 3, 2015. Tax payments shall be made by mail to Tax Collector, Property Owners' Association of Lake Hayward, Post Office Box 230, Colchester, CT 06415.

Geese can be majestic, but learn some ways to prevent them from fouling property

Lake Quality Improvement Committee: Meeting set on watershed management

What's a Lake & Watershed Management Plan (LWMP)?

Does Lake Hayward need a LWMP?

What does it mean to me?

How can I have input to the LWMP?

All good questions and glad you asked. At the Town Hall Meeting at 10 a.m. on Saturday, July 18, you will get answers to the above questions and much more. The Lake & Watershed Management Plan portion of the meeting will be open to all Lake Hayward residents (east side and west side) since protection of the lake is critically

important and a responsibility of all of us. So come learn about the Lake and Watershed Management Plan for Lake Hayward that is under development by the Lake Quality Improvement Committee (LQIC).

Your participation is encouraged to learn about this important long-range initiative for Lake Hayward, learn about threats facing the lake and to offer your perspectives and ideas on the plan and dealing with these issues and threats. Hearing your comments is critical to development of a well-thought-out plan.

Conducting the meeting will be members

of LQIC alongside limnologist Rick Canavan, Ph.D., of CME Associates. Canavan has worked with LQIC in the preliminary stages of plan development. The plan outline, which can be found on the POALH website (http://www.lakehaywardct.com/docs/lakeplan_2015.pdf), is a product of the work performed to date by Rick and LQIC. You are encouraged to review it in advance of the July 18 Town Hall. Please attend if you can. It is a great opportunity for your voice to be heard as we discuss the future of Lake Hayward.
