Monday garbage pickup continues until Sept. 8

All-Waste Control will collect trash and recyclables twice a week (Monday and Friday) through Sept. 8. The Town of East Haddam has implemented "single stream recycling" so it is no longer necessary to separate the various recyclables into separate containers and/or put them out on separate days. All recyclables can be combined and placed into a single container and put out with your regular trash. We must recycle:

1. Glass and metal food and beverage containers (rinsed); lids go in trash

(No broken glass, mugs, windowpanes, ceramics, light bulbs, mirrors, dishes or tempered glass)

- 2. Plastic containers Nos. 1 through 7 (rinsed); lids go in trash
- 3. Newspaper, magazines, cereal/pasta boxes, milk and juice cartons, junk mail

(No phone books, wax- or plastic-coated cardboard, soiled newspaper or magazines, books, plastic (Tyvek) envelopes)

4. Cardboard (broken down)

(No wax coated boxes, soiled boxes, pizza boxes)

Please place your trash in a covered container if it will be outside at night.

POALH LEGAL NOTICE PAYMENT OF PROPERTY TAXES

All persons liable to pay real estate taxes to the Property Owners' Association of Lake Hayward as levied on the October 1, 2014 Grand List are hereby notified that the taxes are due and payable on July 1, 2015 at the mill rate of 3.50. The taxes will become delinquent on August 3, 2015 if not paid by this date. Delinquent tax bills shall be subject to interest of 1.5 percent per month reverting to the due date, July 1, 2015. The minimum interest charge is \$2. All persons in the Tax District who do not receive a tax bill should call the Tax Collector at 860-295-8769 to obtain their bill before the end of the grace period, August 3, 2015. Failure to receive a property tax bill does not invalidate the payment of the tax or related delinquent interest charge if not paid by August 3, 2015. Tax payments shall be made by mail to Tax Collector, Property Owners' Association of Lake Hayward, Post Office Box 230, Colchester, CT 06415.



Third Beach closed to swimming last weekend because of elevated E.coli

Back in 1999, our community was faced with elevated E.coli bacteria levels that closed First Beach for a period of time. A few children became ill and recovered, but after two months of investigation, town and state health officials have never been able to definitively pinpoint the cause of the contamination, citing likely causes to be faulty personal beach hygiene, leaking septic systems or tainted runoff into the lake.

Since that time, the association has remained active in water quality monitoring, septic system maintenance and community education and maintenance of facilities to support beach hygiene. Our challenges are never-ending as there are constant factors that impact water quality and bacteria levels; including heavy rains, seasonal weather, stream flow, water temperature, distance from pollution sources, livestock management practices and wildlife activity, aka "goose poop." As you know, Third Beach was recently closed due to elevated levels of bacteria and as of

Wednesday of this week, continues to be closed to swimming. The initial sampling was conducted the day after heavy rains and observers noted that the sample might have been taken too close to the waterline rather than waist deep. A subsequent sample has shown improvements in the numbers with the hope that the area will reopen for swimming by the time this article reaches

For those of you new to lake living, there are countless numbers of bacteria, viruses and other microorganisms that exist in our environment and also in the bodies of humans and animals. While most are beneficial, about 10 percent are harmful pathogens and are the bacteria that we monitor. The state has two standards for monitoring; a fecal standard and an E.coli standard. Did you know that lakes are known to be cleaner environments compared to rivers and streams?

During the season from Memorial to Labor Day, we sample for water quality on a weekly

basis. We are diligent in cleaning up the goose poop, but this continues to be problematic and likely the source of the current issue at hand. With low water, high temperatures and a heavy rain, it appears we had a "perfect storm" for the spike in numbers. Other lakes have had success with improved bacteria counts by putting up snow fences in the early evening to keep the geese from walking onto the beach. We also need to be sure we are properly disposing of collected matter and find the right solution to clean the swim rafts without disposing into the water. The geese are not the only culprit. From time to time, debris such as diapers, find its way south and can contribute to the problem. So at this time, everyone should be mindful of your kids, mindful of septic pumpout schedules and stay out of the water if you have a stomach or bowel illness. Let's use some common sense to stay worry-free and symptom-free. If you are swimming while the beach is officially closed, please note you are swimming at your own risk.

TREASURER'S REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED JUNE 30, 2015

The Association had another outstanding year from a fiscal standpoint. Revenues exceeded Expenses by \$58,162. The principal reasons are as follows:

- 1. Collection of \$65,112 more in taxes, interest and lien fees (\$227,179) than budgeted (\$162,000) due the aggressive collection policies and attaching liens on delinquent properties where taxes are one year past due and legal action. (An additional \$11,000 was also received at the start of the 2015-16 fiscal year.)
- 2. Interest income increased because of increased balances (\$666.41 vs \$600.00)
- 3. Actual Association Expenses were higher than budgeted (\$169,016 actual) versus an Expense Budget of (\$162,000) as a result of:
 - Increase in printing and postage costs-more communication with members
 - > Decrease in Capital improvements-we budgeted too high
 - Events and Recreation decreased as a result of fewer activities and an aggressive budget
 - Increase in insurance costs of General liability and workers' compensation expenses
 - Increase in Tax Collector stipend due to new tax collector taking over mid year
 - Increase in security monitoring via internet/Comcast
 - Decrease in Public Safety due to less police patrols
 - > Increase in Lake Quality Improvement costs principally related to water quality testing
 - Decrease in real estate taxes-we over-estimated the tax on the Pavilion
 - Increase Legal fees due to FOI request and Charter and By-Law consultation
 - Increase in Properties expenses due to tree trimming and cleanup work from storms and port-o-let expenses....extra cleanings and weeks on site
- 4. In 2014-15, we received \$1575.00 in contributions from East Shore residents. These contributions were used to pay for lake permitting fees and other related costs following Board policy as the use of these funds.
- 5. Last year members approved the dredging of 2nd Beach for an estimated \$38,000. The actual cost of the dredging was \$34,375 which came from specific allocated reserves authorized by members at that meeting. The balance of the reserve was used to reduce tax revenue requirements for 2015-16 in accordance with a policy established by the members two years ago.
