TENNIS COURT USE REMINDER

BEACH RULES

- 3. Infants must be in leak-proof diapers at all times.
- 4. Fishing within 100 feet of the swimming area is strictly prohibited.
- 5. Use of boats and watercraft within the swimming area or within 100ft. of rafts is prohibited.
- 6. When passing a beach area, dogs must be on a leash. Dogs are never allowed on the beach.
- 7. There is no swimming after 11 PM.
- 8. All trash and cigarette butts must be removed from the beach and be properly disposed of.
- 9. Use of the beach area is limited to Association members and their guests.
- 10. Cars parking in a beach parking area must display a POALH parking sticker or a guest pass.

EAST WEST COMMITTEE

This coming Friday, August 15th, 2008, at the Pavilion the East-West Committee of Lake Hayward will be hosting the Chair of the Eight-Mile River Watershed Management Committee, Anthony Irving. He will speak on how and why the watershed area came to be identified and established, and also on the importance of Lake Hayward, a large headwater of the watershed area, in maintaining its lake water quality. As with our other three E-W presentations this summer it promises to be informative, stimulating, and entertaining. We will gather at 6:30 p.m., sign in and greet each other, and probably start the presentation around 7 p.m. There always is a question and answer period afterward with refreshments, and children are always welcome.

A quick report on the most recent, or third, E-W Lake Hayward Informational Meeting which was held on Saturday, July 19th, at the Pavilion. Roslyn Selsky, of the Connecticut Agricultural Experiment Station in New Haven spoke on invasive aquatic plants, and specifically those found in their survey five years ago of our own lake. She gave us a power-point presentation followed by viewing and identifying of plant samples, and handouts of packets to enable us to follow up our own research. The Q & A which followed was manned by a panel including Sue Merrow, former First Selectman of E. Haddam and a signer of the Eight-Mile **River Watershed Conservation** Project; Randy Dill, the Chair of the E. Haddam Inland Wetlands Commission; and Mary Agostini, long-time member of the Inland Wetlands Commission. Discussion centered around regulations controlling use of land at the lake edge, the importance of buffer zones, and the dangers of growing lawns to the water's edge. Randy promised to try to provide us with an abbreviated list of the regulations currently in force.

Also out of this meeting came a disclosure with photo and a petition, started by Ray Mino of East Shore Drive, in response to his noticing an oil slick trailing one of the fishing boats in the lake. When he checked the regulations of the DEP he discovered one allows gasoline engines to be attached, but not used at our lake. The petition asks that the regulation prohibit gasoline-powered engines from even being attached to the boat, so eliminating the danger of oil pollution of the water. The petition was taken up on the West side by both Sandy Zawistowski and Alice Miles, who gathered more names. Another exciting development resulting from that meeting came from a question posed in the feedback form Roslyn distributed, when

someone asked if the Connecticut Agricultural Extension would consider doing a follow-up to the extensive survey they had done five years ago. Kathy and Ken Klein of East Shore Drive received a call from Roslyn Selsky's boss, who happened to be a college classmate of Ken's and recognized their names from the forms turned in. He then assured that a followup survey could be done, whereupon Kathy informed Tim Pelton to coordinate with our current treatments, and we now have that - a free service - to look forward to! The first survey was funded by a special grant with the DEP, but because we have been treating the lake and tracking its water quality, they are interested to do another check on invasive plants!

The last development to come from the East-West Committee is that a speaker from the Eight-Mile River Watershed Management Commission may be the featured speaker at the August 24th Annual Meeting of POALH. We are waiting to hear just which one of these talented and dedicated people will come.
