Frightening Fireworks Facts:

The July 4th holiday is coming up and I am sure that a great time will be had by all particularly if things dry out and the sun comes out for more than five minutes. And by a good time I also mean being safe. The biggest problem with fireworks is that when things go wrong, they go wrong very fast. Whether it is a serious injury or a significant fire, I have seen them all.

➤ Fireworks Facts:

Key Point: Five out of six (84%) of Emergency Room fireworks related injuries involved fireworks that Federal regulations permit consumers to use.

➤ **The highest injury rate occurs in the age group 5-9 years old**

➤ Annually over 9,000 fireworks related injuries are treated at hospital emergency rooms. Note: this number does not include patients treated in doctor's offices or walk-in clinics.

➤ On average there are 3,000 structure fires or vehicle fires each year resulting from fireworks causing \$29 million in direct property damage.

➤ Seven people are fatality injured by fireworks yearly.

➤ The temperature of a burning sparkler varies from 1200 – 1800 degrees based on the material used.

Ironic Fact:

Rhode Island is one of only six states (AZ, DE, MA, NJ, NY & RI) that ban the sale of consumer fireworks. In 2003, 100 people were killed in a nightclub fire ignited by the use of pyrotechnics indoors.

And then there is just stupid:

On July 3, 1996 Todd Hall, age 24, used a cigarette to ignite a fireworks device inside a fireworks store in Protorville, Ohio. When the blaze was brought under control two hours later, of the 40 customers and staff members in the store at the time, 9 were dead and 11 people injured. Ohio is one of the 40 states that allow the sale of consumer fireworks but it is illegal to use them. (Go figure.) I encourage everyone to treat all fireworks with great respect. If using sparklers, please do so with adult supervision. And lastly, NEVER throw sparklers into the lake or leave expired sparklers on the beach. They create a significant hazard to anyone that may step on them.

Enjoy the 4th ... and play it safe.
