Message from the President ~ Tim Pelton

Some times you're never quite sure what you will find

Last Saturday a very hard working crew spent a very hot morning reorganizing the storage unit of the Pavilion and the shed in the back. Buried in a corner was an old file cabinet containing miscellaneous old tax ledgers and miscellaneous information. Here are some of the highlights I found:

Undated - In 1956 the prior name of the Property Owners of Lake Hayward Association was the Lake Hayward Social Association. The Joseph A Smith Company first developed the Lake Hayward area and the company notified the property owners that the company wanted to withdraw its connection from Lake Hayward. The POALH was formed and chartered under Special Act 87 and approved by the General Assembly in Hartford in

1957 - [Therefore our 50th anniversary is coming up next year. Should we do something special? It's food for thought.]

1957 - There was discussion with the local developer Mr. Smith regarding the creation of tennis courts and a store on the corner of Lake Shore Drive and Hilltop Road.

1962 - The cost of a new raft with a four rung ladder for Third Beach was \$90.00.

1963 - All boats need to have address numbers affixed or they will be burned in the annual bonfire. [Hmmm ... interesting motivation ☺]

1964 - The Planning Committee recommended that the swamp within the cove at Second Beach be improved to offer boat launching and create a possible wading area.

1969 - The budget was \$10,000.

1969 - There was discussion of moving the tennis courts because of the existing brook running through the center causing constant upheaval.

1977 - The store at First beach was closed and demolished for the cost of \$100.00.

1979 - Board of Governors minutes. "The problem with our teenagers was discussed. They seem not to want to be entertained. They want to do their own thing and do not want to be told what to do or when to do it." [Let's see, those teenagers are now approaching 40 with teenagers of their own. I guess some things simply do not change.]

1979 - The budget was \$23,000.

1984 - There was a notice for a member's only tag sale. [Interesting idea]

1985 - The headline of the Middletown Press speaks of the interest of Lake Hayward residents to succeed from East Haddam due to the lack of services from the Town.

1987 - The average POALH tax was \$124.00.

1988 - The tennis courts were repaved and a basketball court added for \$10,000.

In closing, there was an interesting review of record keeping. In the 60's, all the tax assessment and payment information was hand written in ledger books. The tax collector was paid \$100. Copies then moved on to the use of carbon paper and then there was the mimeograph era. Record keeping then moved on to typewriters and then to IBM Selectric typewriters. Late in the 80's dot matrix printers were the rage. Remember those?

As the Association continues to move forward, it is just as important to remember where we came from.

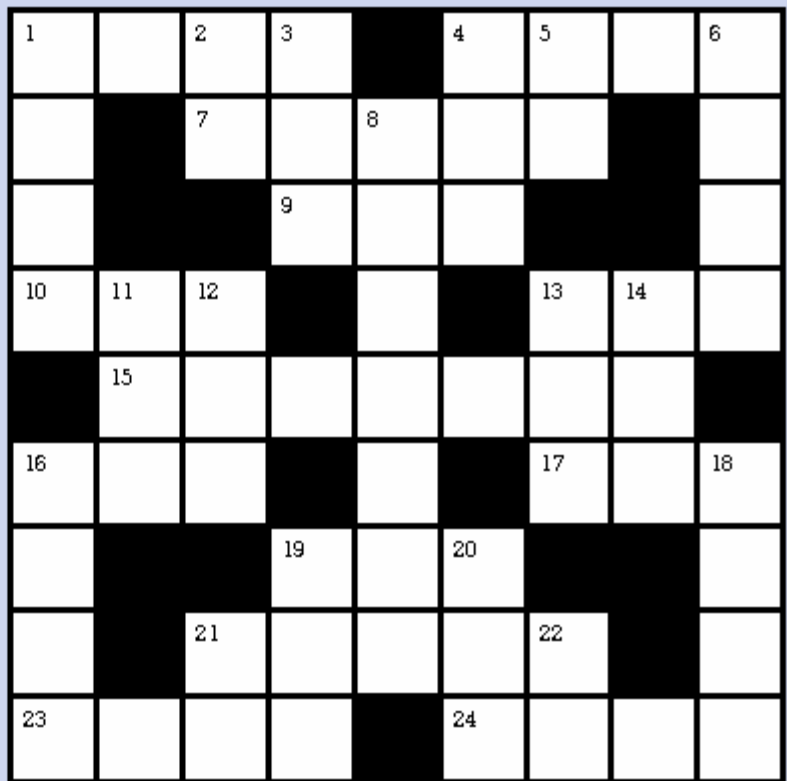
