Message from the President ~ Tim Pelton

Here is a list of items that each of us can do to preserve our most important asset...the lake. Pollution and contaminants enter the lake when rainfall and snowmelt carry accumulated pollutants from lawns and roads into the lake. Ways to reduce this type of pollution includes:

- Minimal use of fertilizers
- Minimal use of pesticides
- Minimal use of herbicides
- Having your septic tank pumped every 2-3 years, (more often if you have a large household)
- Avoiding the use of caustic drain cleaners or putting other harmful chemicals into the septic tank. It will harm the bacteria that keep the septic system functioning properly.
- Becoming a label reader. When possible, use environmentally safer soaps and detergents.
- Never pouring anything in a storm drain.
- Where possible control runoff from your property with landscaping and gardens.
- Mowing you grass to be about 3 inches high. It will stimulate deeper roots for your grass and allows greater water absorption.
- Leaving the clippings on the lawn. They are a valuable source of nutrients and will reduce your need to fertilize the lawn.
