where a person puts their boat at the beginning of the season is respected to be their spot for the season. However, these spots are not forever, year to year. They renew each spring.

Several years ago, the board built boat racks to resolve a problem of abandoned boats in the water creating breeding grounds for mosquitoes and appearing unsightly. Thus, the storage moved from water to land to both today, with the use of docks and mooring points. But the courtesy of first in the spot never changed. Please be respectful of this and do not shuffle the boats in the racks.

One last note about the boat racks. We ask that the boats be removed each season because the racks will not bear the snow

load. More importantly, it resets the racks for each season as noted above.

Please consider your safety as you walk along the shore. We are all familiar with the sharp curve north of First Beach. It was suggested at the June meeting that an alternative walking route be marked. Great idea and we are on it. Look for signs shortly.

Lastly, there is a lot of buzz about the speed of traffic along Lake Shore Drive the last few weeks. We have asked for the Town of East Haddam's Speed Display and are working with the police to enforce the speed limit. But we can be even more effective if we drive the 25 mph limit ourselves. It always comes back to how we ourselves behave, doesn't it?

Now go enjoy the lake and teach your children well.

PROPERTY OWNERS' ASSOCIATION OF LAKE HAYWARD LEGAL NOTICE PAYMENT OF PROPERTY TAXES

All persons liable to pay real estate taxes to the Property Owners' Association of Lake Hayward as levied on the October 1, 2015 Grand List are hereby notified that the taxes are due and payable on July 1, 2016 at the mill rate of 3.50. The taxes will become delinquent on August 1, 2016 if not paid by this date. Delinquent tax bills shall be subject to interest of one and one-half percent per month reverting to the due date, July 1, 2016. The minimum interest charge is \$2.00. All persons in the Tax District who do not receive a tax bill should call the Tax Collector at 860-295-8769 to obtain their bill before the end of the grace period, August 1, 2016. Failure to receive a property tax bill does not invalidate the payment of the tax or related delinquent interest charge if not paid by August 1, 2016. Tax payments shall be made by mail to Tax Collector, Property Owners' Association of Lake Hayward, Post Office Box 230, Colchester, CT 06415.

Help is on the way to protect Lake Hayward watershed with land purchase

There is a 115-acre parcel for sale, most of which is in our watershed. The Colchester Land Trust has stepped up to purchase the land to keep it from being developed into a housing subdivision with all the clear cutting that goes along with that.

The parcel was scheduled to be developed in two phases, one with 12 lots and one with 30 lots, and it is the 30-lot portion that is in the Lake Hayward watershed. The 30-lot section is land and marsh that winds its way directly into Lake Hayward from a distance less than a mile from the north end of the lake.

Land trust president Andy George will make a presentation to Lake Hayward residents at the **July 30 Town Hall** to fully outline the project and offer suggestions on how Lake Hayward residents can provide support.

What: Land Trust hike

When: 9:45 a.m., July 31.

Where: Meet at First Beach Pavilion.

On Sunday morning, July 31, the Colchester Land Trust will offer an 1-1/2 hour walk on the property to residents of the Lake Hayward community. While there are some existing trails, a portion of the walk will be just "in the woods." The total property has some elevation gains, but the walk will focus on the area that drains into Lake Hayward, which is less hilly. Those walking

should dress appropriately, bring water and bug spray. Dogs are permitted, but not encouraged. Plans are to meet at the First Beach parking lot at 9:45 a.m. on July 31 and then carpool to the location on Bulkeley Hill Road (five-minute ride).

We are indebted to the Colchester Land Trust for their efforts to bring this project to fruition. Remember that Lake Hayward is like the bottom of a bowl, everything that happens within our 1,500 acre watershed ends up impacting the lake. It is important that we partner with such efforts to maintain our watershed in its natural state.

Please note the 10 a.m. start for the July 30 Town Hall and the 9:45 a.m. July 31 walk on the property.

Livingston Taylor

Livingston has never stopped performing since those early coffeehouse days, touring with major artists such as Linda Ronstadt, Jimmy Buffett and Jethro Tull, and he maintains a busy concert schedule of over 80 shows a year.

The five souls in Elephant Revival are Bonnie Paine (washboard, djembe, musical saw, stomptbox); Bridget Law (fiddle, octave fiddle); Charlie Rose (banjo, pedal steel, guitar, horns, cello, double bass); Dango Rose (double bass, mandolin, banjo); and Daniel Rodriguez (guitar, banjo, double bass).

The Indie Acoustic Music Project labeled their sound "progressive edge", and "BREAK IN THE CLOUDS, won best CD of 2011 and "THESE CHANGING SKIES" (Thirty Tigers) release went on to win best CD of 2013.

Monday garbage pickup continues until Sept. 6

All-Waste Control will collect trash and recyclables twice a week (Monday and Friday) during the summer and the twice-weekly pickup started on June 13.

The last Monday pickup will be Sept. 6, after which pickup will be on Fridays only.

The Town of East Haddam has implemented "single stream recycling" so it is no longer necessary to separate the various recyclables into separate containers and/or put them out on separate days. All recyclables can be combined and placed into a single container and put out with your regular trash. We must recycle: 1. Glass and metal food and beverage containers (rinsed); lids go in



trash (No broken glass, mugs, windowpanes, ceramics, light bulbs, mirrors, dishes or tempered glass) 2. Plastic containers #1 through #7 (rinsed); lids go in trash 3. Newspaper, magazines, cereal/pasta boxes, milk and juice car-

tons, junk mail (No phone books, wax- or plastic-coated cardboard, soiled newspaper or magazines, books, plastic (Tyvek) envelopes) 4. Cardboard (broken down) (No wax coated boxes, soiled boxes, pizza boxes) 5.

Garbage bags should not be left uncovered for more than one day to prevent animals getting into them.



8. All trash and cigarette butts must be removed from the beach and beach area and disposed of properly.
9. Use of the beach and beach area is limited to Association members and their guests.
10. Cars parking in a beach parking area must display a current POALH parking permit.
11. Beaches and Association properties are closed from Midnight to 6 a.m. Police take notice.
12. No smoking on the beaches.
