I attended church recently and the priest had an interesting homily about silence (and perseverance). Silence indeed has great value. It affords the opportunity to reflect upon things. It offers the opportunity to listen. It can make a great statement by simply saying nothing. In silence, we hear our surroundings - the birds, the frogs, the crickets - life at Lake Hayward.

Silence and reflection: I'm reminded of a friend who visited us at the lake several years ago. They live in Astoria, Queens N.Y. Their children had never experienced total darkness and silence. It scared the daylights out of them! Imagine, being a child and never experiencing total silence. The first year they visited, the kids did not sleep for the first few nights. The parents almost cut their stay short. The kids did not recognize the life around them and until they learned that the frogs and crickets were harmless, they did not understand the beauty of nature.

When they finally understood, they didn't want to leave and could not wait to return the following year and a few years after that. They wanted to hear nature - the birds, the

Property tax payments are due by Aug. 1 to avoid paying interest

The deadline for paying your property taxes is coming very fast and they must be paid by Aug. 1 to avoid paying an interest charge of 1.5 percent per month from July 1 on late payments. If you miss the deadline by even one day, the law requires us to charge you interest on late payments.

For example, if we receive your payment on Aug. 2 or we can't read the postmark on the envelope with your check in it we must assess you 1.5 percent interest per month from July 1 (3 percent). So if we receive your check on Aug. 2 and we can't read the postmark and your property tax bill is \$400, you will be charged \$12 interest. Interest charges cannot be waived and they keep adding up since we apply your payment to the interest charges first.

Remember that a failure to receive a property tax bill is not a valid defense to waive the interest charges. Call or e-mail me if you did not receive a property tax bill. I can send you a duplicate property tax bill, but that does not solve your delinquency problems. The Treasurer has a mailbox at his house at 83 Wildwood where you can drop off your tax payment.

We also do not send out monthly statements notifying you of a late payment. At some point before Dec. 31 we will notify late payers and non-payers of their delinquency and the added interest charges they owe.

PAYMENT OF PROPERTY TAXES

All persons liable to pay real estate taxes to the Property Owners' Association of Lake Hayward as levied on the October 1, 2015 Grand List are hereby notified that the taxes are due and payable on July 1, 2016 at the mill rate of 3.50. The taxes will become delinquent on August 1, 2016 if not paid by this date. Delinquent tax bills shall be subject to interest of one and one-half percent per month reverting to the due date, July 1, 2016. The minimum interest charge is \$2.00. All persons in the Tax District who do not receive a tax bill should call the Tax Collector at 860-295-8769 to obtain their bill before the end of the grace period, August 1, 2016. Failure to receive a property tax bill does not invalidate the payment of the tax or related delinquent interest charge if not paid by August 1, 2016. Tax payments shall be made by mail to Tax Collector, Property Owners' Association of Lake Hayward, Post Office Box 230, Colchester, CT 06415.

Tax Collector's Corner: Address changes need to be made known to POALH

As hundreds of tax bills are mailed out to property owners in our Lake Hayward Tax district, I start to get a dozen bills returned to me each week as undeliverable. We work hard to get your tax bills to you using the address you provide to us.

However, the challenge for us and those of you who have moved is to make sure that the right people are notified promptly. In our case, our property tax bills are developed using the Town of East Haddam Assessor's records to produce our bills. By law, each property owner must report their change of address to the East Haddam

Assessor. The Assessor cannot accept address changes from the Association.

What also complicates the process are situations where the property owner finances the purchase of their cottage or home with a mortgage. In these situations, most banks, mortgage companies and other long-term lenders require the borrowers to escrow their taxes whereby the lender collects

the property taxes from the borrowers and pays the borrower's property tax directly to the town or city. Lenders do not escrow district taxes.

Each property owner in our district can help us. If you have changed your permanent mailing address in the last year, please call the East Haddam Assessor's office at 860-873-5026 to confirm whether the Assessor has your current correct mailing address. Also, please fill out the Lake Hayward Property Owner Information Sheet in the back of this newsletter to record your change of address and return it to us. Your help in this matter is greatly appreciated.

Colchester Land Trust hike will highlight land purchase in lake watershed

There is a 115-acre parcel for sale, most of which is in our watershed. The Colchester Land Trust has stepped up to purchase the land to keep it from being developed into a housing subdivision with all the clear cutting that goes along with that.

The parcel was scheduled to be developed in two phases, one with 12 lots and one with 30 lots, and it is the 30-lot portion that is in the Lake Hayward watershed. The 30-lot section is land and marsh that winds its way directly into Lake Hayward from a distance less than a mile from the north end of the lake.

Land trust president Andy George will make a presentation to Lake Hayward residents at the **July 30 Town Hall** to fully outline the project and offer suggestions on

how Lake Hayward residents can provide support.

On Sunday morning, July 31, the Colchester Land Trust will offer an 1-1/2 hour walk on the property to residents of the Lake Hayward community. While there are some existing trails, a portion of the walk will be just "in the woods." The total property has some elevation gains, but the walk will focus on the area that drains into Lake Hayward, which is less hilly. Those walking should dress appropriately, bring water and

bug spray. Dogs are permitted, but not encouraged. Plans are to meet at the First Beach parking lot at 9:45 a.m. on July 31 and then carpool to the location on Bulkeley Hill Road (five-minute ride).

We are indebted to the Colchester Land Trust for their efforts to bring this project to fruition. Remember that Lake Hayward is like the bottom of a bowl, everything that happens within our 1,500 acre watershed ends up impacting the lake. It is important that we partner with such efforts to maintain our watershed in its natural state.

Please note the 10 a.m. start for the July 30 Town Hall and the 9:45 a.m. July 31 walk on the property.

Monday garbage pickup continues until Sept. 6

All-Waste Control will collect trash and recyclables twice a week (Monday and Friday) during the summer and the twice-weekly pickup started on June 13.

The last Monday pickup will be Sept. 6, after which pickup will be on Fridays

only. The Town of East Haddam has implemented "single stream recycling" so it is no longer necessary to separate the various recyclables into separate containers and/or put them out on separate days. All recyclables can be combined and placed into a single container and put out with your regular trash. We must recycle: 1. Glass and metal food and beverage containers (rinsed); lids go in trash (No broken glass,



mugs, windowpanes, ceramics, light bulbs, mirrors, dishes or tempered glass) 2. Plastic containers #1 through #7 (rinsed); lids go in trash 3. Newspaper, magazines, cereal/pasta boxes, milk and juice cartons, junk mail (No phone books, wax- or plastic-coated cardboard, soiled newspaper or magazines, books, plastic (Tyvek) envelopes) 4. Cardboard (broken down) (No wax coated boxes, soiled boxes, pizza boxes) 5.

Garbage bags should not be left uncovered for more than one day to prevent animals getting into them.

Cold Spring Farm is a newer addition to the lovely, historically agricultural landscape of East Haddam. It is composed of 300 acres of pasture, hay and vegetable fields, and forestland above Lake Hayward and is

home to laying hens, beef cows, pigs, dairy goats, turkeys, peafowl, dogs, cats and an abundance of wildlife.

The farm produces an abundant selection of mouth-watering produce and fruits, as well as gorgeous herbs and flowers, delicious eggs from our happy hens, milk, cheese and yogurt from our goats, meats, cheeses, jams, honey, syrup, corn, and more.

In addition, Cold Spring Farm is home to Common Ground CSA, which stands for Community Supported Agriculture and includes pre-paid shares of produce, herbs, flowers and other farm products throughout the growing season. Our Farm Stand is open practically year-round from dawn 'til

dusk. You can also find our products in Connecticut restaurants, on the campus of Wesleyan University, at farmers' markets in East Haddam, Colchester, Ivoryton, New London, and Groton, at local food co-ops and juice bars, through Connecticut Farm Fresh Express' online farm store and in several other places around the state.

In addition to all this wonderful food, we also host special events such as birthdays and weddings, educational classes, breakfasts On the Farm, tours, and more.


