There are quite a few ways to predict the future – tea leaves, tarot cards, palm reading and late night TV. While these might be entertaining, I'm not sure they are quite what the Board and the Budget Committee need to propose a budget that will take effect more than a year from now. How about two, five or even 10 years from now? This really makes one take a good, hard look at our obligations.

Some things are easy. I'll call them necessary expenses – insurance, taxes, utilities, communications, operating costs and waste management. As with any family or business, these funds must be budgeted. I estimate these are about 55 percent to 60 percent of any budget and will probably remain in this area for many years. Lest we forget, we have continuing property maintenance responsibilities as well. I anticipate routine property maintenance to be 10 percent of the budget. So our total necessary operating expenses are probably in the area of 70 percent in any given year.

Some things are tradition. They are what define our character – who we are as a community. I think our social calen-

dar and recreational opportunities set the tone here. We are an active recreational community with a host of events and facilities for families and friends to enjoy. These are usually under 10 percent in any given year not including the property maintenance.

The Properties Committee has identified maintenance and capital needs that will have a short-term effect on the budget during the next few years. These property improvements will have a life span of 20 to 50 years, so we are investing in our future.

Some things are obligations we have committed ourselves to as responsible citizens – managing the lake quality and developing a comprehensive lake management plan that will both preserve our environment

and maintain our property values.

When you sit down with these priorities and start to dig into specific activities, you realize there is also substantial overlap among all three. For instance, property maintenance and lake quality contributes to property values, social obligations and even social activities such as the beaches and pavilion. Insurance protects our tangible and financial assets.

The Budget Committee refers to a strategic plan in their report. The Board has realized that we need to set forth a financial plan that projects expenses more than one or two years into the future.

This will enable Association members to determine what projects will be undertaken when and how they will be funded while better managing the mil rate.

Developing the strategic plan will enable us to better predict the future.

Ouch! Too much work. Let's go enjoy the lake. Teach your children well.

PAYMENT OF PROPERTY TAXES

All persons liable to pay real estate taxes to the Property Owners' Association of Lake Hayward as levied on the October 1, 2015 Grand List are hereby notified that the taxes are due and payable on July 1, 2016 at the mill rate of 3.50. The taxes will become delinquent on August 1, 2016 if not paid by this date. Delinquent tax bills shall be subject to interest of one and one-half percent per month reverting to the due date, July 1, 2016. The minimum interest charge is \$2.00. All persons in the Tax District who do not receive a tax bill should call the Tax Collector at 860-295-8769 to obtain their bill before the end of the grace period, August 1, 2016. Failure to receive a property tax bill does not invalidate the payment of the tax or related delinquent interest charge if not paid by August 1, 2016. Tax payments shall be made by mail to Tax Collector, Property Owners' Association of Lake Hayward, Post Office Box 230, Colchester, CT 06415.

Tax Collector's Corner: Address changes need to be made known to POALH

As hundreds of tax bills are mailed out to property owners in our Lake Hayward Tax district, I start to get a dozen bills returned to me each week as undeliverable. We work hard to get your tax bills to you using the address you provide to us.

However, the challenge for us and those of you who have moved is to make sure that the right people are notified promptly. In our case, our property tax bills are developed using the Town of East Haddam Assessor's records to produce our bills. By law, each property owner must report their change of address to the East Haddam



Assessor. The Assessor cannot accept address changes from the Association.

What also complicates the process are situations where the property owner finances the purchase of their cottage or home with a mortgage. In these situations, most banks, mortgage companies and other long-term lenders require the borrowers to escrow their taxes whereby the lender collects

the property taxes from the borrowers and pays the borrower's property tax directly to the town or city. Lenders do not escrow district taxes.

Each property owner in our district can help us. If you have changed your permanent mailing address in the last year, please call the East Haddam Assessor's office at 860-873-5026 to confirm whether the Assessor has your current correct mailing address. Also, please fill out the Lake Hayward Property Owner Information Sheet in the back of this newsletter to record your change of address and return it to us. Your help in this matter is greatly appreciated.

Public safety report: Boating saves lives, but can't be taken for granted

In recent years, Lake Hayward has seen a dramatic increase in the use of watercraft – pontoon boats, paddleboats, canoes, kayaks, small sailboats and paddleboards, all making being careful on the water even more important. When boating on Lake Hayward or any multiuse body of water, here are some tips to keep you and others safe.

Take a boating safety course. Although Connecticut law does not require a Safe Boating Certificate for all watercraft, you are still expected to know the “rules of the road.” For instance, motorized craft must yield the right of way to non-motorized craft and boats being passed have the right of way. Courses are offered by the United States Power Squadron, the Department of Energy and Environmental Protection and other private providers.

Public Safety Report

Keep your speed down. The Connecticut Boaters Guide, published by DEEP (2016 edition) states “No person shall operate a motorboat, excluding a personal watercraft, at a speed in excess of ‘slow-no-wake’ within 100 feet of shore or a dock, pier, float or anchored or moored vessel.”

What does “slow-no-wake” mean? The Boaters Guide explains that “a vessel shall not produce more than a minimum wake and shall not attain speeds greater than six miles per hour.” As Lake Hayward is long and narrow, much of the time boaters will be within 100 feet of the shore or floating docks.

Steer clear of rafts. Our POALH Rules and Regulations (effective June 1, 2014)

state that operating a vessel within 100 feet of an Association raft is prohibited. This is good advice and boaters should stay clear of all rafts.

Watch for swimmers. Know what (and who) is in front of you, on your sides and behind you at all times. Designate someone else on your boat to help you watch for swimmers outside the swim lines. Swimmers need to recognize that they blend into the water if you're not wearing a brightly colored cap and watch for boats.

Wear your life jacket. U.S. Coast Guard-approved life jackets must be worn by children under 13 years old and there must be readily accessible life jackets on board for each person on your vessel.

Enjoy your watercraft while being mindful of everything and everyone around you and we will all enjoy our beautiful lake.

CPR class registration still ongoing for instruction at the Pavilion on Aug. 20

No one pre-registered for the CPR class scheduled for July 23 so the class was rescheduled for Saturday, Aug. 20 from 1-4 p.m. at the First Beach Pavilion.

The American Heart Association's Family and Friends CPR course teaches CPR and relief of

choking in adults, children and infants. It is designed for members of the general public who would like to learn basic CPR, including families with children or elderly relatives and those who do not need a course completion card. Course fee includes textbook and participation card. This

Monday garbage pickup continues until throughout August; ends on Sept. 6

All-Waste Control will collect trash and recyclables twice a week (Monday and Friday) during the summer and the twice-weekly pickup started on June 13.

The last Monday pickup will be Sept. 6, after which pickup will be on Fridays only. The Town of East Haddam has implemented “single stream recycling” so it is no longer necessary to separate the various recyclables into separate containers and/or put them out on separate days.

All recyclables can be combined and placed into a single container and put out with your regular trash. We must recycle: 1.



2. Plastic containers #1 through #7 (rinsed); Glass and metal food and beverage containers (rinsed); lids go in trash (No broken glass, mugs, windowpanes, ceramics, light bulbs, mirrors, dishes or tempered glass) 3.

4. Newspaper, magazines, cereal/pasta boxes, milk and juice cartons, junk mail (No phone books, wax- or plastic-coated cardboard, soiled newspaper or magazines, books, plastic (Tyvek) envelopes) 5. Cardboard (broken down) (No wax coated boxes, soiled boxes, pizza boxes) 5.

Garbage bags should not be left uncovered for more than one day to prevent animals getting into them.



9. Use of the beach and beach area is limited to Association members and their guests.
10. Cars parking in a beach parking area must display a current POALH parking permit.
11. Beaches and Association properties are closed from Midnight to 6 a.m. Police take notice.
