Tax Collector's Corner: Address changes need to be made known to POALH

As hundreds of tax bills are mailed out to property owners in our Lake Hayward Tax district, I start to get a dozen bills returned to me each week as undeliverable. We work hard to get your tax bills to you using the address you provide to us.

However, the challenge for us and those of you who have moved is to make sure that the right people are notified promptly. In our case, our property tax bills are developed using the Town of East Haddam Assessor's records to produce our bills. By law, each property owner must report their change of address to the East Haddam

Assessor. The Assessor cannot accept address changes from the Association.

What also complicates the process are situations where the property owner finances the purchase of their cottage or home with a mortgage. In these situations, most banks, mortgage companies and other long-term lenders require the borrowers to escrow their taxes whereby the lender collects the property taxes from the borrowers and pays the borrower's property

tax directly to the town or city. Lenders do not escrow district taxes.

Each property owner in our district can help us. If you have changed your permanent mailing address in the last year, please call the East Haddam Assessor's office at 860-873-5026 to confirm whether the Assessor has your current correct mailing address. Also, please fill out the Lake Hayward Property Owner Information Sheet in the back of this newsletter to record your change of address and return it to us. Your help in this matter is greatly appreciated.

Lake Hayward Days Triathlon, Beach Games, Carnival, Food Festival and Movie on the Beach

Today is the third annual Lake Hayward Triathlon. The triathlon is a non-competitive event Lake Hayward residents of all ability levels can enjoy swimming, biking and running around our beautiful lake.

The event consists of an approximate 1/3-mile swim, 12-mile bike ride and 4-mile run around Lake Hayward. Participants assume all risk associated with this event. - * Coordinate with the properties committee chairman/woman to ensure that the pavilion has

been cleaned prior to all POALH and private events,

- * Maintain completed event recap forms and evaluate success of events, and
- * Develop social budget for the next fiscal year.

Pavilion Reservations

Provide the association membership with an avenue to reserve the pavilion for private parties. The social chairman/woman will manage all reservations, calendar entries in the Office 365 Calendar as well as on the POALH website, and disposition of deposits as stated on the reservation form.

Monday garbage pickup sends on Sept. 6, which is one week from Monday

All-Waste Control will collect trash and recyclables twice a week (Monday and Friday) during the summer and the twice-weekly pickup started on June 13.

The last Monday pickup will be Sept. 6, after which pickup will be on Fridays only. The Town of East Haddam has implemented “single stream recycling” so it is no longer necessary to separate the various recyclables into separate containers and/or put them out on separate days.

All recyclables can be combined and placed into a single container

and put out with your regular trash. We must recycle: 1. Glass and metal food and beverage containers (rinsed); lids go in trash (No broken glass, mugs, windowpanes, ceramics, light bulbs, mirrors, dishes or tempered glass) 2. Plastic containers #1 through #7 (rinsed); lids go in trash 3. Newspaper, magazines, cereal/pasta boxes, milk and juice cartons, junk mail (No phone books, wax- or plastic-coated cardboard, soiled newspaper or magazines, books, plastic (Tyvek) envelopes) 4. Cardboard



(broken down) (No wax coated boxes, soiled boxes, pizza boxes) 5.

Garbage bags should not be left uncovered for more than one day to prevent animals getting into them.

Beach Rules



1. Parents or chaperones are responsible for their child's safety and their child's actions at all times.
2. Children cannot be left at the beach unattended.
3. Infants must be in leak-proof diapers at all times.
4. No fishing from the beach and within 25 feet of swim area.
5. Dogs are never allowed on the beach.
6. Vehicles are not allowed on any beach at any time.
7. No glass on any beach or in the pavilion.
8. All trash must be removed from the beach and beach area and disposed of properly.
9. Use of the beach and beach area is limited to Association members and their guests.
10. Cars parking in a beach parking area must display a current POALH parking permit.
11. Beaches and Association properties are closed from Midnight to 6 a.m. Police take notice.
12. No smoking on the beaches.


