

Road closure Saturday for carnival and beach games

Permit to Discharge raffle postponed till Sept. 4

It was brought to my attention in the days leading up to and at the general membership meeting on Aug. 20 that some of our residents were having trouble getting their "permit to discharge" paperwork from the Chatham Health District although they were up to date on their septic maintenance.

We discussed this at the meeting and decided it was only fair to postpone this raffle until Monday, Sept. 4 and to also

accept another form of proof. You can now submit a receipt from an authorized septic company stating that you have had your tank pumped out if you do not have the paperwork from Chatham Health.

This receipt must show that you've had it done in the last three years with the oldest date acceptable being Sept. 4, 2014. You must get them to me beforehand at 271 Haywardville Road, the last home by the dam. Please put them in my mailbox. I will also be at Ladies Night on Aug. 25 and you are more than welcome to bring them to me there.

Do you know the story of East Haddam's 'Moodus Noises'?

Apparently located in an area of East Haddam which includes Cave Hill and Mount Tom, where the Salmon and Moodus Rivers come together, legend tells of loud and sometimes violent ground quakes. The early inhabitants of the area, the people of the Pequot, Mohegan and Narragansett tribes believed the rumblings were brought on by the god Hobomoko. They called the area Machimoodus

meaning, "the place of bad noises." Many other legends and tales have been passed along to describe the reoccurring noises including chemical explosions beneath the earth, the pressure from a giant pearl which blocked an underground cavern, and pearls in the mussels in the Salmon and Connecticut Rivers. Modern research have attributed the Moodus Noises to shallow "micro earthquakes."

Beach Rules



1. Parents or chaperones are responsible for their child’s safety and their child’s actions at all times.
2. Children cannot be left at the beach unattended.
3. Infants must be in leak-proof diapers at all times.
4. No fishing from the beach and within 25 feet of swim area.
5. Dogs are never allowed on the beach.
6. Vehicles are not allowed on any beach at any time.
7. No glass on any beach or in the pavilion.
8. All trash must be removed from the beach and beach area and disposed of properly.
9. Use of the beach and beach area is limited to Association members and their guests.
10. Cars parking in a beach parking area must display a current POALH parking permit.
11. Beaches and Association properties are closed from Midnight to 6 a.m. Police take notice.
12. No smoking on the beaches.
