

Lake Hayward Meeting
June 28, 2009

Nominating Committee – 3 area representatives are needed for this committee.

Septic – should be pumped every two years

Treasurer – Lee reviewed the highlights – there were no questions.

Social – Dave E. – reviewed the summer calendar. Diane Comacho suggested a trip to see the CT Sun play at the casino. She will place information in the newsletter.

John Jacoby – some people are having boats taken. A reminder was given that as of Nov. 1st, any boat left at the beach will be taken to the ball field to be sold or destroyed. Dave Glassman stated that people are putting stakes in the ground at first beach. He was advised a boat rack is going there also.

Swim lines – they are not within the law unless we have a permit. Sue is still researching the tons of paperwork needed to get a permit.

POALH – taxes are going out the first week of July

Tim Pelton – weed report. Yearly we need to do a little “fixing” with a big expenditure every 4-5 years.

Jane Webster – the petition from last year regarding changing the rules and not allowing motors to be on the boats at all was discussed. Even if we changed it, enforcing it is a huge problem that the lake people would have to do.

The meeting minutes are now on line for people to view.

Dead Fish – it was noticed that there were dead fish in the lake. It is caused by spawning shock and happens cyclically.

Garbage cans – the men must be able to lift them so do not get excessively large ones. RECYCLING is a must at the lake in order to not have to pay dumping fees at another location outside of Colchester.

Beach garbage cans – people are throwing dirty diapers etc into the cans. If this continues, the cans will be taken off the beaches and people will have to take their garbage home with them.
