Another week has flown by at Lake Hayward, with bingo and arts and crafts for the kids, as well as arts and crafts and the Second Beach Pot Luck for adults. July is a memory as we work our way to the POALH annual meeting on Aug. 18 and Labor Day weekend shortly thereafter.

Some members may have seen Ed Bader, Corinne Halliday, Gary Petersen and another man at the south end of the Lake one day this week. They were looking at the spillways in advance of having our dam inspected. Our dam is considered a Class BB dam, requiring inspection every seven years. Our insurance carrier also requires periodic inspection. It was last inspected by the state in 2012, but the State no longer removed. We anticipate that does the inspections itself. The Department of Energy and Environmental Protection has a list of approved dam inspectors, and proposals were ob-

tained from two, before consulting engineer Karl F. Acimovic was interviewed and hired.

Before inspection can proceed, all vegetation and overgrowth, both on the sides of the spillways and in front of the berm in the water must be the engineer will visit our site two to three times, both when the water overflows the spillways and when the water level is lower.

He will then prepare a report of the inspection findings, including specific problems, recommendations for maintenance and repairs, modifications and/or improvements. We are including \$10,000 in our proposed capital reserve budget for 2020-21 for dam repairs, should they be needed.

Good luck to all playing in the golf tourney. Remember to stay hydrated in this heat and humidity.

# Engineer hired to begin inspection of Lake Hayward dam on lake's south end

Our dam inspection is underway. Every seven years, as required by the state and our insurance carrier, the dam is inspected. We have hired engineer Karl F. Acimovic to do the inspection for us. A preliminary visit was made by him and he has asked us to cut down some of the foliage abutting it to prepare for a thorough inspection in the coming weeks. A report will be generated with recommendations for any work that may need to be done. Your budget committee and board have planned for some potential repairs being necessary.

As stated in an email blast last week, the Lake Quality Improvement Committee has

placed a new marker at the deepest part of the lake for the purpose of having a consistent location for lake water sampling and testing. The buoy was installed on July 26 across from Second Beach, approximately halfway across the lake. It has a reflective strip on it. We kindly ask that you do not disturb it. This sampling and testing will continue through October of this year and in future years to improve our understanding of lake dynamics. Thanks, as always, to the volunteers dedicated to this testing program.
