Weed treatment targets invasive plants; survey found on website

As planned, our contractor Solitude Lake Management, treated our lake for invasive weeds on June 23. There is a pre-treatment survey map on your POALH website under Lake Management. This survey is done every year in order to pin point locations that need to be treated.

LAKE QUALITY

The legend on this map mentions both fanwort and inflated bladderwort (Utricularia inflata) which is a plant that was detected in our lake last year in a survey done by the Connecticut Agricultural Experiment Station (CAES). This was done free of charge. We will be educating ourselves more on it. The weed treatment was targeting this also as best as it could as it does have a tendency to move around.

Although milfoil is not

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Nominating committee seeks new slate of candidates for Board of Governors

The nomination committee has been appointed by the board president to present a slate of candidates to fill the vacant Board of Governors positions to be elected at the Aug. 16 Annual Meeting. The Board of Governors consists of nine elected members who serve as follows:

- Six (6) members for a term of two (2) years each, two from each district, three terms to expire in even years and three terms to expire in odd years.
- Three (3) members at large for a term of three (3) years, one (1) term expiring each year

In 2020, there will be four (4) vacancies: three vacancies with two-year terms ending in 2022 and one three year-term that ends in 2023.

In 2020, the terms of the following four Governors expire:

- Janet Depratti, Representative at Large, completing 3-year term
- William Taylor, Third Beach Representative, completing 2-year term
- Bonnie Sudell, Second Beach Representative, completing 2-year term
- Jeffrey Conway, First Beach Representative, completing 2-year term

mentioned on the legend of this map, the treatment would treat that also if present in the targeted areas. As most of you know, we did not treat last year due to a delay in getting a permit from DEEP. We received one this year that is good for three years.

Benefits of some plant life

The majority of the plant life in the lake is very beneficial. Native aquatic plants act as a barrier, filtering fertilizers such as nitrogen and phosphorus from runoff, and denying these nutrients to algae. They also block sunlight to algae. They are an important food source for our fish. We would

encourage our lakefront owners to leave native vegetation for these reasons and more

As mentioned above, a survey was done last year by Greg Bugbee of CAES, in July to identify plant species in our lake. We would encourage you to go to www.ct.gov/caes/ and search "Lake Hayward".

You will find the 2019 plant survey along with other information gathered through the years. There is a lot of valuable and interesting information there.
