## Be a lake steward by following these easy-to-execute maintenance tips at home

Help us every day to ensure the quality of our lake water. By adopting these activities every family can be lake stewards.

- Regularly scoop up after your pet. Scoop it, bag it and trash it.
- Don't feed the ducks or geese. It is not healthy for the birds and feeding them increases the resident time of waterfowl at our lakes and may encourage them to overwinter rather than migrate. This will result in unhealthy levels of fecal matter and bacteria getting into our lake.
- Wash your car in your yard or preferably at a licensed car wash so that residue does not filter down to the water.
- Avoid using weed and feed. If you must use a pesticide, treat the weed, not the en-

tire lawn.

- Go native with your plantings. Planting native drought-tolerant plants on your property will reduce the need for fertilizers and excessive watering. They are a valuable habitat for birds and other wildlife.
- Use a mulching lawn mower, which will help decrease your need to fertilize your lawn.
- Please do not compost near the shoreline. Bins should be at least 25 feet away

from the shoreline to prevent excess nutrients from leeching into the lake.

- Be thoughtful when cleaning and maintaining docks.

Creating a sand beach is often an objective of shorefront residents but they do negatively impact water quality. If one exists currently please reclaim any sand that drifts into the water each year and install a barrier to stop it from happening. Our association beaches are on a schedule of sand reclamation. New beaches are discouraged and may require a permit. Accumulating sand in the water accelerates the filling process of the lake and adds to the sediment load. We all have our part to play to help our healthy lake stay that way.
