Tax Collector's Corner Lynn Crisci

What is a Special Taxing District?

There is a common misconception that the Property Owners' Association of Lake Hayward (POALH) is not a municipal entity, and that the taxes paid to POALH are not the same as the taxes paid East Haddam.

That would be incorrect.

POALH is a Special Taxing District.

Special Taxing Districts are independent, special purpose governmental units, formed and existing independently from local governments, such as towns or counties. The most famous special taxing unit is the Reedy Creek Improvement District, which was formed by Walt Disney World Co. in Florida.

Special Taxing Districts are found in most states and can be defined by services provided or by geography. In Connecticut, there are four groups allowed: 1) fire districts, 2) utility districts (water, sewer, lighting), 3) improvement association districts (condominiums and private developments) and 4) beach and lake association districts. POALH is the fourth type of District and is a fully filed and approved taxing entity under the auspices of the State of Connecticut.

As a Special Taxing District, POALH may acquire and sell private property, provide any service a municipality can (except education), impose and collect taxes on property within its District, borrow money, and own, operate and maintain public improvements.

Your tax dollars paid to POALH support beach maintenance, garbage collection, the pavilion, the ballpark and everything in between. There are a number of articles about Special Taxing Districts on-line, and the Office of Policy and Management, State of Connecticut, is another good source of information about Districts like ours.

Invasive Weed Treatment May Be Delayed

In a meeting on June 13, 2023 with Solitude, our treatment contractor, we learned the CT DEEP has not yet approved our three year treatment permit. We are not aware of any problem with it, but apparently the delay is being caused by staffing issues. The good news is that when we do receive it we will be able to treat further north by the boat launch. The treatment date will likely change from June 27th to July 10, 2023. As always, there will be restrictions on certain uses of the lake on the treatment date and the following few days. Signs will be posted throughout our lake community with this information and treatment date as usual. Please follow the instructions. We are sorry for any inconvenience this may cause.

The East Shore Gazette, dated May 2023, has been posted on the POALH website. It's a newsletter produced by our neighbors on the east side. Please do us a favor and read it with a focus on the article entitled "So, Where's The Algae?". Please take the need for all of us to properly care for our septic systems seriously and the other tips contained in this article to reduce unwanted runoff into our lake. In the meantime, your Lake Quality Improvement Committee is working on a program to further study the nutrient loading from our outflows in our watershed with the help of Northeast Aquatics. Further news to come soon as to what that will entail.

We are a committee made up of residents from both sides of our beautiful lake and I cannot thank them enough for all their hard work.

Welcome Back to the Beach

The weather is finally cooperating, and Third Beach is ready to welcome you back.

You'll notice the Property crew has been hard at work. The wood bench has been repaired and is wearing a new coat of fresh white paint. The Property folks have the docks installed, and the beach is being raked.

A couple words about one of the traditions that make Third Beach unique: Umbrellas

Umbrellas are purchased by Third Beach for everyone's use and enjoyment. These aren't porch umbrellas, which are heavier, and so more dangerous when it's windy. These are true beach umbrellas.

Beach umbrellas are lighter, but they are also more susceptible to damage, and we have an unusual number of umbrellas that have already sustained damaged in the early weeks of the season. We know we have a number of new families, so thought we'd share some tips to keep the umbrellas safe.

Here's the 101 on beach umbrella use:

- 1. If you bury the post! The post should be buried at least a foot into the sand. There's a technique (and you can find it on YouTube). Once you have the post buried, use your foot to fill in the sand around it, and keep an eye during the course of the day to make sure it doesn't work loose.
- 2. For metal Umbrella Stands: If you're using one of the metal stands, bury the stand at least 6 inches, and/or place heavy things on it to give it extra weight. If there's a breeze, consider using a second stand, setting it on the windward side (where the wind is coming from. If you can't tell, wet your finger and hold it up. The cold side is the windward side)
- 3. Never Walk Away From Your Umbrella: If you're leaving the beach to grab lunch at home, or going swimming, lower your umbrella. Your towel and chair won't mind, and it will save the umbrella from tipping and breaking

The umbrellas are a great tradition, but they are costly. If we all follow these guidelines, we'll have plenty available for everyone to enjoy for Summer 2023.
